

## Part 2- I Can See the Sparks

### Key Points:

Gen. 2:21-25 NLT- The earliest sex education passages in the Bible point to sex as something to enjoy within the context of a life long relationship within marriage.

- Male and female in Hebrew= *ish* and *isha*

Back to Song of Songs:

Song of Songs 1:12-14- The picnic date. En-Gedi is a place of oasis (refreshment, rest and pleasure. Do you have a non-sexual En-Gedi?

Song of Song 2:1-7- The moment of insecurity. The lover reassures.

- Make your words sweet and gentle
- If your intentions are clean then you are not afraid of publicly expressing it
- It also means you are committed
- The best things are worth the wait
- Sex is best enjoyed when you wait till it is within the context of marriage

Song of Song 2:15- There are foxes that can ruin a vineyard

- Dismissing the value of the male and female differences
- Unrealistic expectations
- Emotional and sexual junk food

Song of Song 2:16- When lovers become one.

*Relationship involves 2 imperfect people and so we all need grace*

*Through the grace of God, your/our sexual past and sins can be forgiven, can be cleanse, can be restored.*

**Lie-** *you can't restore sexual integrity.*

**Truth-** *You may have to suffer some consequences (the single mom encounters challenges caring for her kid, those who made mistakes may suffer hurt, etc) but God's grace can restore your sexual integrity.*
